- 1. Design of a runway or runways
- 2. Order issued requiring aircraft that meet specific criteria to remain on the ground at their location
- 3. Location from which aircraft flight operations take place
- 4. Rules governing all of aviation activities
- 5. Comprehensive suite of state-of-the-art technologies that allow aircraft to move more safely and efficiently from private jet airports to their destination
- 6. Documents which provide a sole agency-wide system that the FAA uses to deliver advisory (non-regulatory) material to the aviation community
- 7. Common network of U.S. airspace
- 8. Area beyond the takeoff runway under the control of airport authorities within which terrain or fixed obstacles may not extend above specified limits
- 9. Provides grants to public agencies, private owners and entities for the planning and development of public-use airports
- 10. Announcement filed with an aviation authority containing potential hazards along a flight route
